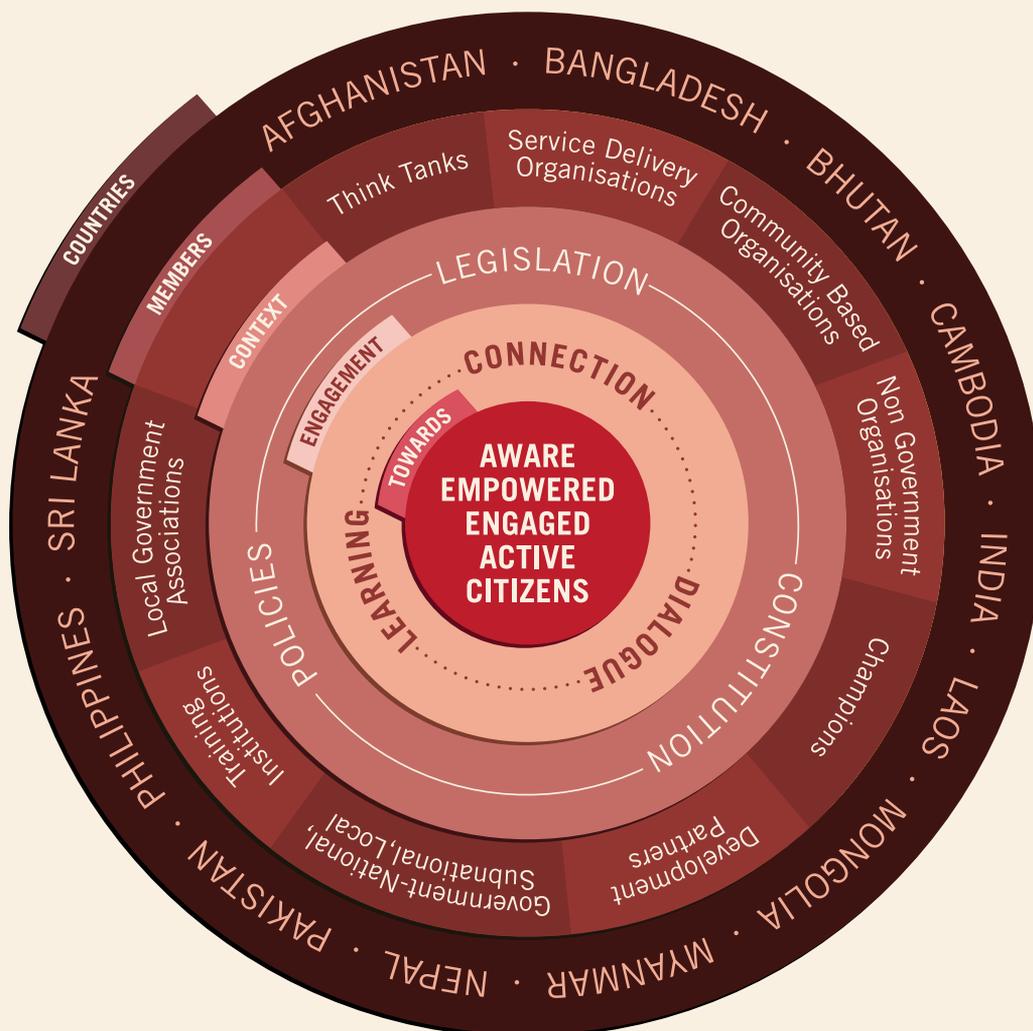




Local Governance Initiative and Network

Many committed governments, organisations, groups and communities in Asia work together through Local Governance Initiative and Network (LOGIN) to improve people's participation in effective governance in local areas so that services reach those who need them, in time, and as promised.

Members include elected representatives, training institutions, think tanks, government departments, civil society organisations and academics from 12 countries in South and East Asia.



Value Proposition

MEMBERS

Non-hierarchical space for state and non-state actors to connect, ideate, and collaborate

Access to regional and global expertise, technical resources, and wide range of tools to match different institutional needs

Opportunity to gain from multiple perspectives of peers working in diverse contexts with complementary interests

Exposure to innovative learning methodologies which are founded on principle of 'expert – learner' duality and emphasise linking of theory and practice

Scope to revisit and align respective institutional strategies and actions informed by peer advice and experiential learning

Tap into South-South learning and exchange anchored in the Asian context, culture and ethos

Opportunity to gain from analysis of contextual factors influencing local governance reforms as impetus for effective action by member institutions

Scope for national and transnational coalition-building to strategise and implement reform actions

Neutral space for policy dialogue aided by apolitical professional facilitators

Access to democratised knowledge which is simplified and translated for differently mandated Asian change agents

Change Pathways

LOGIN connects state and non-state actors within and across national borders, to promote a culture of learning and exchange on the state of governance in a local context. The resultant assessment of potentials for change contributes to issue-specific intervention strategies, enhanced institutional capacities and strengthened coalitions for effective action.

Ultimately, LOGIN aims for capacitated local institutions that enable participatory, accountable, inclusive and citizen-responsive governance.

Enhanced coherence in strategy and actions among stakeholders at the country level for citizen-focused local governance

Strengthened effectiveness of change agents with better knowledge and skills for their work on governance

Increased access to plurality and diversity of perspectives on decentralisation and local governance for nuanced articulation of issues

Greater connectedness across peers, with potential for collaboration and coalition-building in the region

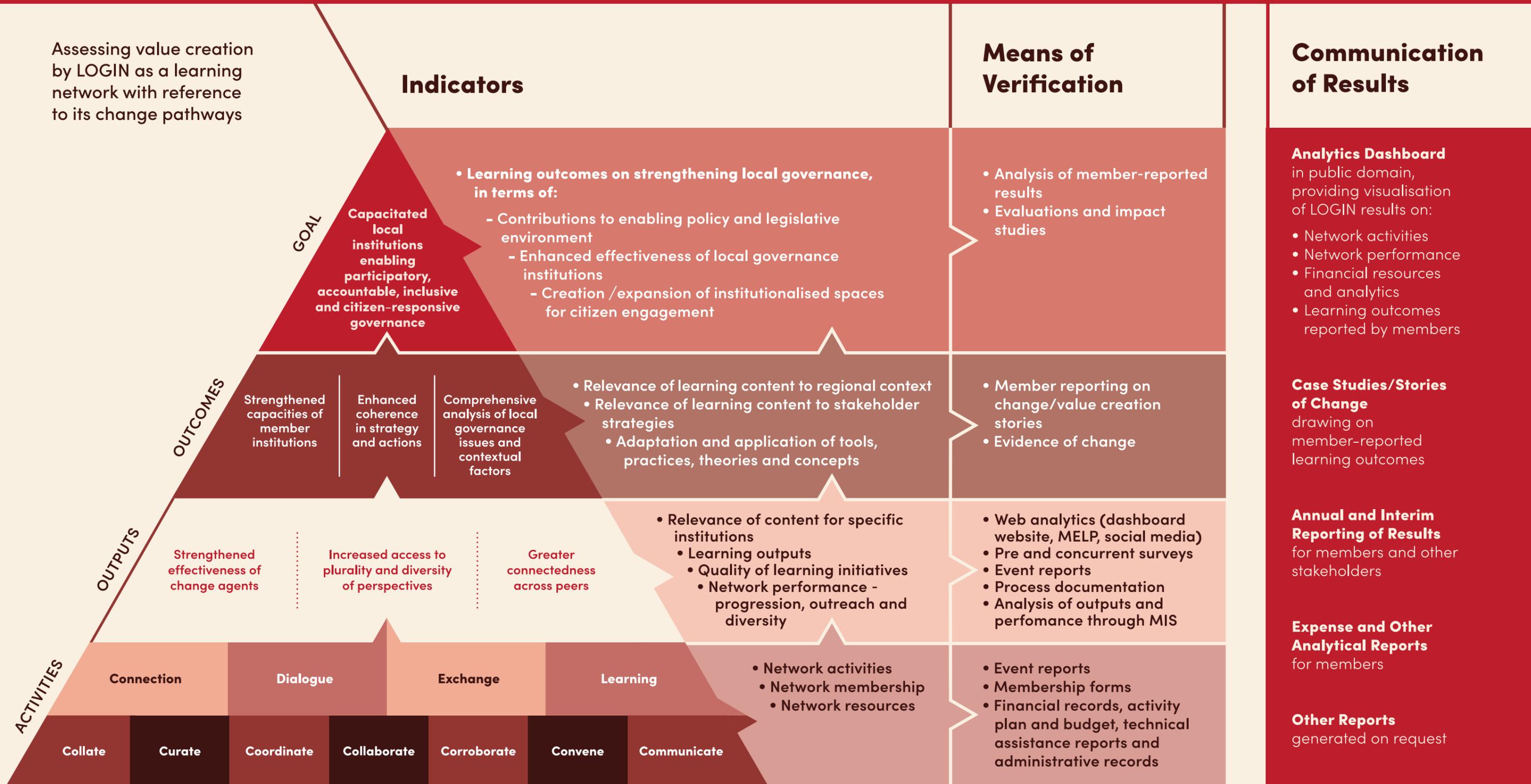
